Dear Robert J. Terry,

I am glad to say that the 2019 VSC decals have arrived at HQ and will be mailed out to the Squadron Commanders starting December 1, 2018.

As we get closer to the end of the year, again I would like to remind you of an important date.

All Vessel Safety Check forms (ANSC7012 and ANSC7012A) must be submitted to the data base by November 30, 2018 to be counted for this year's awards.

This information is very important. In addition to the awards, it is used to determine the number of decals to be issued next year.

Please verify that your submission have been accounted for by viewing them on: <u>https://www.usps.orginational/hq/vsrpt2.txt.</u> Just scroll down to your District and Squadron to verify your input.

If you are a VSC Chair remember to submit each newly qualified Vessel Examiner for a Merit Mark. In addition, any Vessel Examiner who completes 10 **or** more VSCs this year, should also be submitted for a Merit Mark.

I take great pleasure in thanking you for all of your hard work this year.

I also want to put a short notice for all Squadrons to contact me with a total of all the 2019 NYS Boater's Guides that they want next year. I will be distributing them as last year, at the Winter Council and the Spring Conference/ Full boxes can be sent directly to the Squadron.



### **A Different Perspective**



Recently, Alexandra and I attended the District 22 Fall Council and Conference which was held in Punta Gorda, Florida. District 22 consists of 16 Squadrons that are located on the West coast of Florida. I thought you might find it interesting to see how another

District has their meetings. I am not suggesting their way is better, just different. The venue for all the event was terrific. The hotel, the meeting location and the boat club are all adjacent to Peace River and within walking distance of each other.

District 22 is fortunate to be able to have their meetings at the Charlotte Harbor Events Center which has several small and large meeting rooms. Most of the members of the District are relocated seniors from the North and therefore, they do not have to worry about having meetings during the week. Although meetings did not begin until Friday, October 5, 2018, because we live nearly three hours away from Punta Gorda, we chose to arrive on Thursday.

This year, the District tried something new. On Friday morning, there was a Commander's meeting that was represented by all but one Squadron. A questionnaire was previously prepared and distributed to each Commander and then the Commanders commented on the questions. After all the questions were addressed, the group broke into smaller groups to continue the discussion. After a working lunch, each group gave a 2-3 minute summary of what was discussed.

The District Council meeting was held in the afternoon for about two hours after which we proceeded to the Punta Gorda Boat Club for an inexpensive Octoberfest Buffet Dinner. The buffet was catered but the desserts and beverages were supplied by the Squadrons.

Saturday morning began with two rounds of workshops, each running about  $1^{-1}/2$  hours. Some of the topics were "Use of Open CPN software", "What's new in Education", "Fall Cruise Planning Classes", HQ 800 — Membership's Friend" and a Town Hall meeting with the District Commander and the National representative. There were display tables, a Chinese Auction and a teaching aid display.

Lunch and the award ceremonies were combined. After a short break, the Conference was held. Every Squadron was represented with 9 of the Squadrons having 100 % of their authorized delegates present. The meeting comprised strictly of reports and business that had to be conducted. The time seemed to go by quickly due to the different kinds of short meetings. The Conference was over by 3:30 and all were invited to the D22 Hospitality room that was in the Conference Center. Everyone was on their way home by 4:30.
