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At the Helm

I was first elected commander of Berkshire Power Squadron in 1989. I had been a member for barely three years and I had spent two of those years serving as Administrative Officer. I served as commander for two years and then again in 2001 for three more years. Finally last year I accepted the opportunity again. During these six years I have written over 25 commander messages.

This message is the hardest.

For many years the Berkshire Sail and Power Squadron (we changed our name in 2004 to clarify and include our members

who are sail boaters) has struggled each year to find willing and qualified members to serve on our bridge and executive committee. While this has almost never been a slam-dunk task, it has become increasingly difficult and now impossible.

We are at a point with 64 members where there are less than ten members who are willing to take a leadership position or help teach our courses. Our class size is now typically 2-4 members. There are twenty or fewer members who attend our social events with their guests. I have written a couple messages and articles during this past year telling how difficult our leadership search is and asking for help. No help has been received.

Every group I know seems to have this same problem of acquiring members who are willing to lead and bring fresh ideas to their organization. New members join us each year, but our yearly membership losses exceed those gains. Very often a new member does not take advantage of our courses or attend social events. We do make a strong effort to reach out to all new members as well as our sustaining members to attend our events. Sometimes we are successful, but more often we are not.

You will be receiving a letter soon that will announce the proposed bridge and executive committee for next year with a plea for you to attend the Change of Watch on April 26th. This will be a very important meeting. If at that time we do not receive a commitment from the membership to replace the proposed slate of officers, we will propose a plan to dissolve this squadron and return our charter to National.

Please attend. This is the eleventh hour.

CELESTIAL NAVIGATION

Our resident JN and N course instructor, P/C Al Burbank, SN offered this explanation to his students many years ago. For those of you who have taken either of these two courses, this document needs no explanation. For those of you aspiring to become an accomplished Junior Navigator or Navigator, this information offers great insight.

This document contains a brief but comprehensive explanation of celestial navigation principles. It is written in simplified terms to provide clarity and reduce confusion.

A good navigator knows where he is at all times. He knows this because he knows where he was or where he was from where he is (whichever is greater) and he obtains a difference or deviation. The navigator then uses this deviation to plot a correction from a position where he was to a position where he isn't, thus arriving at a position or location where he wasn't, but now is.

Therefore, it becomes obvious to the most casual observer that since the position or location where he is now is the position or location where he wasn't, it then follows that the position or location where he was is the position or location where he now isn't. In the event that the position or location where he is now isn't the position where he wasn't, he now has acquired a variation (variations are caused by other factors which are not within the scope of this document).

A variation is the difference between where he is and where he wasn't, but should be. Variations can be corrected for by the navigator, provided he knows where he was in addition to knowing where he now is and wasn't. The thought process should proceed as follows: because a variation has modified some of the information which he has obtained, he is not sure where he is. He therefore, is sure of where he isn't (within reason) and he knows where he was. He then subtracts where he should be from where he wasn't and by differentiation he obtains the algebraic difference between where he shouldn't be and where he was; he is, therefore, able to obtain the difference between its deviation and its variation, which is the plot.
