COLREGS Rule 5

Every vessel shall at all times maintain a proper lookout by sight and hearing as well as by all available means appropriate in the prevailing circumstances and conditions so as to make a full appraisal of the situation and of the risk of collision.

A recent article in *Sounding* (August 2018) discussed this very important regulation in detail.

The author pointed out that "all appropriate means" includes but not limited to the following which could be found on boats depending on size: radar, AIS, a radar plotting aid, vessel traffic services, certainly essential a VHF radio and binoculars.

2 Knots that need to be reviewed

BOWLIN:

Easy to tie and untie, won't jam, and increases, as tension is applied.

SHEET BEND:

Use to join 2 lines together—never use a square knot which can separate.

- 2. You must practice activating the EPIRB using the testing guidelines. During an emergency is not the time to learn to use it.




New Westport Police Boat

Sailboat Rules for those who Sail

- 1. A boat being overtaken has the right-of-way.
- 2. A starboard tack boat has the right-of-way over a port tack boat.
- 3. A leeward boat has the right-ofway when boats are on the same tack.
