

U.S. Department of Homeland Security United States Coast Guard



Several months ago the Coast Guard rescued four fishermen after abandoning their boat off the coast of Rockland, Maine.

The captain of the 76-foot fishing vessel Aaron & Melissa II radioed watchstanders at Coast Guard Sector Northern New England at approximately 7:45 a.m., reporting the fishing boat was taking on water.

An HC-144 Ocean Sentry aircraft and MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter aircrews launched from Air Station Cape Cod and located the raft and fishermen. A rescue swimmer deployed from the helicopter and hoisted all four fishermen to the helicopter.

The aircrew landed in Brunswick, Maine, where they were met by emergency medical service personnel and transported to Mid Coast Hospital. The fishermen were reported to be in good condition. The weather was reported to have 20-foot seas, 30-knot winds, and the water temperature 50 degrees.




February Quiz Answers

Question #1 in last month's quiz asked about the affect a very large ship has on the wind vis-a-vis a small boat. Walter Paul a longtime SRSPS member pointed out that in addition to blanketing the wind causing loss of steerage, additional dangers are the the ship's lookout might not be able to see you. There might also be an increase in wind which would affect your ability to handle your boat.

Question #2 asked about boat speed and burying the rail on a hard chime boat. Walter points out that while it is indeed true a hard chime boat will tip easier, any sailboat with the rail in th water will be spilling wind and therefor go slower.


