## City of Water Day Festival

On July 14, Westchester Sail and Power Squadron participated in the annual City of Water Day Festival in New York City at the invitation of North River Sail and Power Squadron of District 4.

John Steger, Paul Okura and Bill Spitz from WSPS were joined by Susan Ryan, D2 Cdr and SPRO of Greenwich Sail and Power Squadron.



We took Paul's 21ft Yamaha jet propelled power boat down the Hudson River from Piermont to Governor's Island early in the morning

and started to patrol and escort paddlers in and around Buttermilk Channel next to the Governor's Island.

Along with kayaks and canoes several schooners and tall ships participated in the City of Water Day Festival in New York City which was organized by the Metropolitan Waterfront Alliance.

It was an all-day festival filled with a variety of events on Governor's Island and Liberty State Park to raise the awareness of the general public towards the importance of keeping the waterfronts in the New York



Metropolitan area clean, safe and vibrant.

We used the United States Power Squadrons® metal club

sign on Paul's boat to publicize that we were representing the United States Power Squadrons®. All of us wore special red USPS T-shirts made by District 4.

On one occasion we actually had to put our boat in between a speeding commercial vessel and the paddlers to block the large wake created by the



commercial vessel, and the water came over the bow of our boat and got some of us wet. We just turned on the bilge pump and got the water out but it was a good reminder to all of us that all power boats must slow down if they see paddlers on the lake, river or at sea.



There are two reasons for the need to slow down. The first obvious reason is so that we don't run into these low profile boats. Another reason is that even if you don't hit the boat, the wake from your power boat can topple these boats over or push water into them.

We have worked together with District 4 on the NYC Boat Show, and Practical on the Water Training in Old Greenwich, CT. so we are really excited that our friendship and collaboration with them is expanding as we can learn from each District's best practices and lend manpower and support to each District's events.



## **GOING AGROUND** or What to Do When Your Bottom Hits the Bottom

**Ohmigosh – we’ve run aground!** Ugly words, aren’t they? But, unless you’re far offshore, you may be faced with shallow waters and narrow channels and you have to know what to do when your bottom hits the bottom.

First is safety! After having everyone put on a life preserver, determine if you, your crew, or your passengers are hurt. Cruising into an immovable bottom at 15 or 20 knots can cause people to fly about. If someone has been hurt, determine the nature of their injury and whether they need medical assistance. If so, use your VHF radio to call for help.

The second concern is for your boat. Check your bilges to see if there are any holes (**you’ll quickly notice water**). **Your boat won’t** immediately sink, but you will need to prevent your vessel from getting into deeper waters. If you can repair the hole(s), great! If not, call for help.

There are several ways to get your boat back into the water:

- You can wait until the tide comes in and your boat floats again. Watch that **wind or current doesn’t push your boat** further into shallow water; consider setting an anchor.
- If your boat is small enough, someone can jump over and push it into deeper water in his or her PFD with a lifeline attached to the boat. Remember to turn your engine(s) off. On a sailboat, have those aboard go to one side or the other to help get the centerboard or keel off the ground.
- If your boat has outboard or inboard-outboard engines, you may be able to raise the lower unit so that the


propellers are off the bottom enough to motor into deep water. **Don’t try to** motor off with inboard engines as you may suck sand into the water intakes.

- You can use a method called “kedging,” which entails setting an anchor and using it to pull your boat back into deeper water.
- Call for help. If you have a towing contract, call your provider. If not, emergency services will assist in calling a commercial towing service.

Can you prevent going aground in the first place? One answer is to know the waters **that you’re in and to have current charts** available. The United States Power Squadrons® offers a complete education program designed for recreational boaters. Take advantage of these classes and other available education for an edge in keeping your bottom off the bottom.

In addition, we are preparing a great lineup of guest speakers for our Thursday evening General meetings, including a Sandy Hook Pilot, Bill McGovern, who will tell us on October 25<sup>th</sup> about what he sees (or does not) when piloting some of those huge freighters. It will be an eye opener (no pun intended).

We are especially proud to announce that in late June, all 6 Advanced Piloting Students passed with a grade better than 90% and received the following comment from the Grader "Excellent!" In addition to passing a written test, 5 of the six students were able to join us for a hands-on On-the-Water-Training class at Stamford aboard Paul Zengara and Ruth Harkins beautiful 31 foot Tarten.

We also have three members who have recently passed the On-the-Water BOC test, Howard Sklar, Andy Papadremetriou and John Steger. So we now have 5 members who have completed this Boating Certification. Congratulations to all!!



## New Inflatable Life jackets Impact the VSC

Inflatable Life Jackets (PFDs) have gone through an evolution, since the production of the VSC manual, which affects the VSC process.



At the time the VSC manual was produced essentially all inflatable jackets were type "V" and required that they be worn to be counted as a viable life jacket. There are now many USCG certified inflatable life jackets available that are type II and type III when used on recreational vessels in addition to type Vs. Further the need for the jacket to be worn to count is dependent on the specific USCG certification of each individual jacket model. Whether the jacket must be worn is printed on the label affixed to the inside of the jacket itself. Therefore:

***Vessel Safety Examiners must now check the label on the inflatable jacket to determine whether or not it must be worn to count.***

### **A Safety Note from the Port Captain**

We all know that the hurricane season is upon us. Would you have been prepared had Isaac run up the East Coast and hit our area? Is your vessel prepared? If it is moored, be sure your mooring chains are in good shape and the bridle is the right length. Check chains from your mooring buoy right down to the anchor. Check your shackles. Be sure to use USA made shackles; all shackles are not equal! Is the anchor OK? Bilge pumps OK? Lines OK? Batteries topped up?

If you are at a slip, put out extra fenders and dock lines. Remove dodgers and biminis and make sure sails are double tied down. Did we forget anything?

After a hurricane we all see boats on the shore that broke away from their moorings. How about some extra protection? Run another line from your mooring buoy (ball) to your vessel. Make sure you have chafing protection for your lines. Be Safe, Be Good!

## Vessel Safety Examinations

Under the direction of our VSC Chair Paul Okura, we have added two new Vessel Safety Examiners, Joe Pizzuti and Andy



Papademetriou, and so far this year have done 36 Vessel Examinations. **And we're not finished yet!** In addition, Frank Palmieri supervised a member of the City Island Sail and Power Squadron, Nelson Font, in order to allow him to attain his certification. This is another example of our Squadron reaching out to nearby squadrons for mutual assistance. Congratulations to all our Vessel Examiners for a job well done, Paul, Frank, John, Andy and Joe.

## Mandatory Education for NY Boaters

Sometimes it takes one or more tragedies for our elected representatives to act. When it comes to boating fatalities, the NY State Legislature has introduced bills over the last few years that would require a mandatory safe boating certificate for engine driven vessels, but they have yet to be voted upon.



The bill introduced in the Assembly (A03550) has been sent to the Rules Committee. The companion bill in the Senate (S06633) has been sent to the Transportation Committee.

Another bill introduced (A06452) having boaters with a safety certificate, be eligible for a liability insurance premium discount, was passed by the Assembly and sent to the Senate, who sent it to the Insurance Committee.

It is hoped that the above bills will be voted upon in the January session.
